A. Assam Electronics Development Corporation Limited (AMTRON):

The HCDG College offer Internship Programme to students of 5th semester as Minor 6 in accordance with the NEP 2020 and UGC guidelines under Dibrugarh University. Assam Electronics Development Corporation Limited (AMTRON) offer Internship programme to students under AMTRON Internship Programme 2025. The students were selected on the basis of their skill aptitude. AMTRON is a public sector undertaking under the Department of Information & Technology, Govt. of Assam. It introduced Internship Programme alignment with UGC guidelines. It provides training on Computer Application to the undergraduate students with a view to enhance cooperative learning, community engagement, digital literacy, soft skill, cooperative level communications and working environment for students.

Dr. Leena Dutta, Assistant Professor, Department of Education was appointed as coordinator of Internship cell of the college. As nominated Nodal officer of the college, she formally coordinates with University Relations Cell of Amtron for conduction of internship programme. Mr. Hemanta Bori, Junior Assistant was appointed as Nodal person for arrangement of Internship programme. He acted as Resident Mentor. Ms. Dimpri Chauhan, Faculty, PolyInfotech, Computer centre, Nitaipukhuri was appointed as Resident Faculty.

The 61 students of BA 5th semester were registered under AMTRON and got a registration number. The party published a final list of students with SAMARTH enrollment number. The programme covers topics including interactive session on ICT tools, Office management, Financial Management & Financial Instruments, and Communication & Work ethics. The programme was conducted in a hybrid mode. The online classes were taken by industry expert and offline Interactive session was taken by Resident Faculty. The classes were held from 26 June to 25 July 2025. The classes was held for a duration of 120 hours.

In the beginning, an awareness seminar on Internship programme was conducted by AMTRON where various aspects related to the programme was informed. Both the theory and practical classes were held in the classroom as well as in the computer laboratory of the college. After completion of the class, various topics on social issues were assigned to students to prepare a project either individually or group. The presentations of the projects were taken place on 19 November 2025. A committee of four members comprises of Mrs. Manashi Gogoi, Associate Professor, Department of Education, Dr. Tarun Gogoi, Associate Professor, Department of History, Dr. Bornali Saikia Sonowal, Assistant Professor, Department of Economics and Dr.

Leena Dutta, Assistant Professor, Department of Education as mentor evaluated each project. 20 marks is assigned for successful completion of the Internship, 40 marks for Internship report and 40 marks assigned for presentation of project. At last, each qualified student was certified by Amtron.
